## Update: Major Old Towne Projects by Jeff Frankel, OTPA Preservation Chair

### CHAPMAN UNIVERSITY

More on-campus student housing is a top priority for the University, the community and OTPA. We're working together so that capacity will be such that as many students as possible will live on campus.

The City's Design Review Committee has approved the **VILLA PARK PACKING HOUSE** project which the school hopes to open with 402 new beds in time for fall 2019 enrollment. The design style will be sensitive to the industrial heritage of the neighborhood. The restoration and rehabilitation of the historic packing house will allow for student services plus the relocated Hilbert Museum of California Art. There is progress on the exciting **PANTHER VILLAGE II PROJECT** off I-5 Freeway (not in Old Towne!) with the selection of Togawa Smith Martin as architects. Chapman's Board is currently reviewing various project options. The project could add upwards of another 900 beds to Chapman's housing capacity. Plans are also being considered for The **NORTH RESIDENCE HALL PROJECT** that would be located at their residence hall block north of Walnut Ave. that could add an additional 640 beds.

### CODE ENFORCEMENT

The City is updating the Old Towne Design Standards for the first time in decades with improvements to make it clearer and easier to understand. Some changes may have an impact on rehabilitation and preservation projects you may be planning for your home, other accessory or commercial buildings, or site improvements within the Historic District.

The City Community Development Department and the Old Towne Preservation Association are co-hosting an Old Towne Town Hall to present the highlights and to welcome community input and comments. Parking progress took place July 26 at official Ground Breaking Ceremonies for the \$33.2 million multi-level Old Towne Metrolink Parking Structure on N. Lemon. OTPA was involved in advising on the early design of the 611-space building scheduled to open in late 2018, with five levels of parking featuring electric car hook-ups and bike lockers. The first trains came to Orange in 1880, and Metrolink service started in 1994. 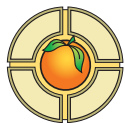
